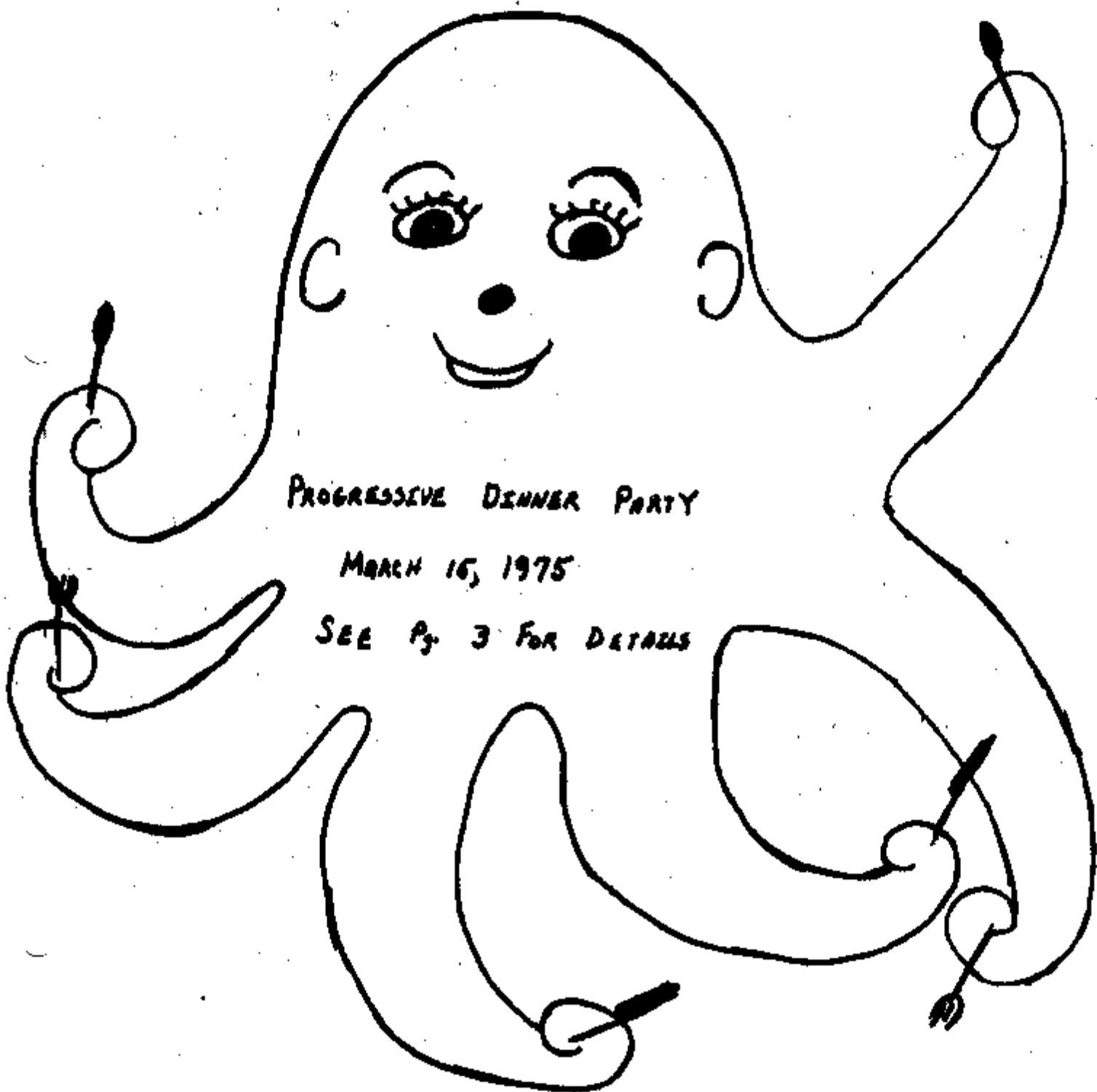

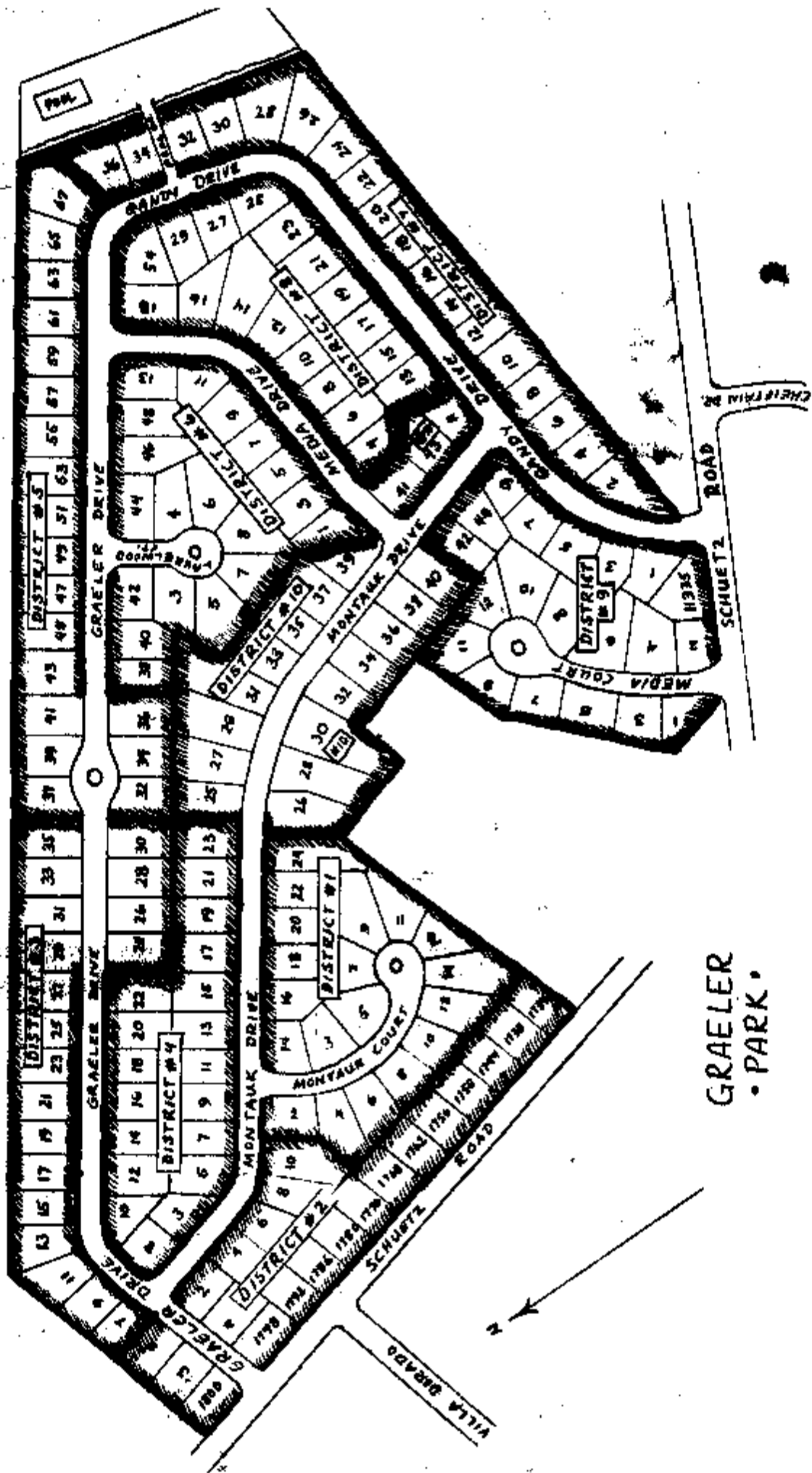

Adult Progressive Dinner Party

The Graciar Park Community Association invites you all to attend our 1st social event of the new year - a progressive dinner party. It will be March 15th at 7:00 p.m.

For those of you who have never attended a Progressive Dinner Party, you start at one house for the 1st course of a meal (hord'oeuvres and drinks in our case) and progress to three other homes for each portion of the meal.. 2nd stop salad, 3rd stop - main courses, and 4th stop - dessert. There will be different people at each stop. The 1st and 4th courses will enable you to meet 12 different couples while the 2nd and 3rd courses will be limited to groups of 4 couples to preserve the hostess' sanity and home.

To make our event a success everyone involved must be a hostess or co-hostess. Hostesses are only at their homes for their particular course and then move on to other homes with the crowd. If you are unable to host in your home it will be necessary to serve as a co-hostess to the hord'oeuvre or dessert hostess by contributing your hord'oeuvre or dessert. The cost of tickets will cover all expenses for the hostess (not the co-hostess). Hostesses will not incur any expenses other than the \$3.00 per person ticket cost.
